A Message from Pastor Barry McCarthy

Friends in Christ,

Eugene O'Neill wrote these three, short, significant sentences: "Man is born broken. He lives by mending. The grace of God is glue!" Ernest Hemingway wrote in <u>A Farewell to Arms</u>, "The world breaks everyone, and then some become strong at the broken places."

We have entered into the season of Lent. This is a time to contemplate the brokenness of the world and ourselves and consider the wonder of God's grace in our lives. That grace is reflected in Jesus coming into the world to let us know that amidst the suffering, God is with us, God loves us, God does not forget us and, most importantly, God will never let us go.

That reality was reinforced for us during the first two weeks of our Lenten Soup and Bread talks. We heard the inspired faith stories of members whose varied life stories reflected the presence of God's grace in everyday living.

Lent lets us walk along the pathways of Jesus, put ourselves in the story, and follow him to the Cross and then onward to the empty tomb of Easter.

There are two more "Soup 'n Bread Supper" meals scheduled for March 13 and 20. Each will be followed by other members sharing their stories, please join us.

Holy Week will begin with Palm Sunday on March 24, followed by a Maundy Thursday service on the 28, at 7:00 PM which will take us from the table of the Last Supper and to the crucifixion. The ecumenical Good Friday Walk is our final preparation prior to the celebration of the Easter miracle. (Time to be determined.)

There will be two services on Easter morning: 7:00 AM outside at the gazebo in the Memorial Garden (coffee and donuts to follow) and 10:00 AM in the sanctuary.
