WE are Called to Care

Summer is a difficult time for some children in our community who experience food insecurity when school is not in session. The children at Chatham Court will receive bagged lunches Monday-Thursday (courtesy of Sarah's On Main) and a pizza lunch on Fridays. However, the children are often without substantial food over the weekend.

Our church will provide three Saturday cooked breakfasts for 50 children and 20 accompanying adults. (June 29, July 20 and August 10) Thank you for the wonderful response for the June 29 breakfast!

For July 20, eggs, American cheese slices, grapes, and cans of Juicy Juice are needed.

For August 10, boxes of French toast sticks, packages of turkey sausage links, fresh peaches and gallons of whole milk are needed.

On the weeks that we are not cooking breakfast, we will prepare a nutritious "grab and go" bagged breakfast that will be distributed to the children on Fridays. The bagged breakfasts are being made possible by generous donations from the Women's Fellowship as well as some church members. Thank you!

A Message from Pastor Barry McCarthy

My Friends in Christ,

Are you ready for summer?

Hopefully, it will be a time for rest and relaxation, though no doubt busyness will also be present. No matter the season of our year or life, there is often a constant yearning for a closer walk with God. That is perhaps the biggest challenge of our spiritual lives---How do we pay attention to God?

I would like to share with you one of the classic spiritual exercises first taught by Ignatius of Loyola in the 1500s which I find personally to be quite helpful. The exercise is called "The Examination" and it is a wonderful way to carve some "God Time" out of our demanding days.

A DAILY EXAMINATION OF GRACE

(Adapted by Kent Ira Groff from "The Spiritual Exercises of Ignatius of Loyola")

Paying attention at the beginning or end of the day.

Find a quiet restful place and invite the Christ, the Light of the world, to walk with you as you recall in your mind the past twenty-four hours, gently sifting through events and encounters.

- 1. GIFT: Give thanks for the day's gift(s). *Celebrate God's empowering love at a time or times during that period.*
- 2. STRUGGLE: Notice times when you struggled to be loved, or loving to someone else. *Note some unrest in your soul, something unresolved. Celebrate God's undefeated love and hear God say to you: "1 know that and I love you." "You are my beloved."*
- 3. INVITATION: Ask God, "What grace do I need to name and claim to be more whole, in this new day?" Allow a word or phrase an image or metaphor to come to mind. Begin to repeat it, slowly, in rhythm to your breathing, or visualize it if it is an image. (Silence)... Imagine you are looking at a movie of your future life and seeing how that phrase or image might be lived out.

Finish with a line of a poem, a scripture, or a hymn verse that comes to mind. Try following this grace-revealing exercise on a daily basis and you will hopefully find that closer walk with the Lord you seek.
