MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



SAMIMI FAMILY UPDATE

In the Summer of 2021 as the US pulled out of Afghanistan, we were all haunted by images of the thousands trying to reach the airport in Kabul to flee the takeover by the Taliban. We strongly felt God's call to take action and in September of 2021 our church spearheaded an effort to resettle a refugee family. As we realized the scope of the undertaking, we reached out to the community for help. Area houses of worship, businesses and over 50 volunteers came together to prepare to welcome a family in need. In March of 2022 we celebrated the arrival of the Samimi family. We have continued to be a support to the family as they have settled in Middletown.

Last year the Samimi family was finally granted Asylum and Special Immigrant Status as Mr. Samimi had worked administering contracts with the Department of Defense. In September, the Samimis submitted their application for their green cards. They have not yet received their green cards, which even though they are here legally, makes them more vulnerable to the actions of our current government.

Zuhra, 14 and Suheil, 16 are entering grade 10 at Middletown High. They both volunteer in several different areas and regularly attend enrichment opportunities. Both are now a part of the Upward Bound program which is held at Wesleyan University. In May Zuhra was asked to read poetry in Persian and in English for a program sponsored by Cuatro Puntos. The dance is beautiful, and the poetry is inspiring. Zuhra did an amazing job.

Sohrab, 9 and Sodoba, 7 are very dear active children. Sohrab, who loves cars and soccer, will enter the 4th grade this fall, and Sodoba, who loves crafts and dolls will start 2nd grade. Both children enjoy reading and going to the library.

The 3 older children regularly attend religious classes at the Broad Street Mosque where they are studying the Koran.



Ajmal was recently laid off from his position as the Chief Financial Officer at Turquoise Mountain Charity due to the cessation of USAID funding. He is busy networking and filling out applications. His expertise is in finance and administering grants. He has always worked at Non-Profit enterprises.

The Samimi family is extremely grateful to our church for our continued support and encouragement. We ask for prayers as Ajmal continues his job search, for their safety and their comfort as they navigate the unsettling immigration situation, and for thanksgiving for bringing this family into the care of our church.
